Cervantes' *Don Quixote* is the most widely read masterpiece in world literature, as appealing to readers today as four hundred years ago. In *Fighting Windmills* Manuel Durán and Fay R. Rogg offer a beautifully written excursion into Cervantes' great novel and trace its impact on writers and thinkers across centuries and continents. How did Cervantes write such a rich tale? This edition of the World Bank has been revised and expanded by the Terminology Unit in the Languages Services Division of the World Bank in collaboration with the English, Spanish, and French Translation Sections.
