Not all men and women with ADHD have the same degree of physical activity. Some may have a low degree of activity, while others may be highly active. Researchers believe ADHD may have a strong genetic component because of their work with twins. No research concludes that poverty, family problems, and too much television or consuming large amounts of sugar causes ADHD, though these factors may exacerbate symptoms.
